DESCRIPTION

Set of four chairs by Japanese designer Isamu Kenmochi, circa 1970.

Crafted from solid beech wood, these chairs feature a dark varnished finish that highlights the quality of the wood and the precision of the design. The backrest consists of five slightly curved vertical spindles, while the seat is covered in its original brown faux leather, evoking a simple and functional spirit.

This model embodies the discreet elegance of Japanese furniture from the 1960s, influenced by the approach of Isamu Kenmochi, an essential figure in modern Japanese design. His work, bridging Western rationalism and Japanese tradition, remains a reference.
