DESCRIPTION

Blown glass bowl by the French artist Claude Morin, a leading figure in the renewal of glass art in France. Settled in Dieulefit from the 1970s, he developed a style that is both refined and expressive, highlighting the depth of color and purity of form.

Mouth-blown in deep blue tinted glass, this large bowl features a wide, open silhouette with sober lines that emphasize the density of the material and the subtle transparency of the hues. Its generous size makes it a striking piece, at once

functional object and decorative sculpture, fully embodying the artisanal and poetic craftsmanship of the artist.

Signed underneath the base: Morin Dieulefit.
